1) Welcome and Introductions

Andrea opened the meeting by acknowledging that McMaster University sits on the traditional Territories of the Mississauga and Haudenosaunee Nations, and within the lands protected by the "Dish With One Spoon" wampum agreement. (ref: IEC May 2016). Participants were then invited into an introductory round.

2) Approval of Minutes, March 22, 2017

The minutes were approved as circulated.

3) Presentation: Sexual Violence Policy, Intake Offices

Meaghan Ross, Sexual Violence Response Coordinator and Pilar Michaud, Director Equity and Inclusion Office, and staff from the Intake Offices, Employee Relations,

Student Support and Case Management, Faculty of Health Sciences Professionalism Office Intake Offices presented on the Sexual Violence Policy.

The presentation provided a high level overview of the policy and the responsibilities of community members under this policy.

All members of the community, all university-related activities and all instances of sexual violence are covered by the Sexual Violence Policy.

The presentation was followed by discussion on rolling out training to departments, staff and faculty.

4) Presentation: John Williams

John Williams is a former Canadian Football League player and co-producer of the CFL documentary The Gridiron Underground. His work history includes outreach with the John Howard Society, community partnerships with the Hamilton TiCats, and healthy living programs with Hamilton Wentworth District Schoolboard. He is currently working with Indigenous Student Services to coordinate a field day for kids from Six Nations and downtown Hamilton in advance of the 2017 North American Indigenous Games hosted in July.

He cited Colin Kaepernick, LeBron James and more for using sports as a platform for social change. And asked: what are the programs or initiatives McMaster Athletics are currently involved in that focus on the access, retention and recruitment of racialized and Indigenous student athletes?

Bernie Custis, the first Black quarterback in professional football history was also the head football coach at McMaster University. He is in the CFL Hall of Fame, and McMaster Hall of Fame.

John presented a proposal for a Bernie Custis Leadership Program — to mentor racialized and Indigenous students in relation to a predominately white institution. This program would include skills development through a speaker series, faculty dinner series, professional development activities and community outreach projects.

John also presented a proposal for an Agents of Change Summit - which includes a 2 day multifaceted leadership program where Student-Athletes Equally supporting Others (SAESO) learn from each other.
